

Child Sexual Exploitation

Is your child being sexually exploited?

Child sexual exploitation is when a child or young person is in an exploitative situation and receives gifts or other items as a result of performing sexual activities to the abuser. It can also occur through technology when a child or young person is persuaded to post images on the Internet.

Your child might:

- Truant from school
- Show a major reduction in their performance in schools
- Have bruising to parts of their body
- Display major mood swings with aggression to others
- Regularly and excessively use drugs and alcohol
- Be very tired and lethargic
- Change their appearance
- Stay out late and not return home
- Have unexplained relationships with older people
- Be dropped off in unknown vehicles
- Receive unexplained gifts such as mobile phones, expensive clothes
- Self-harm e.g. cut themselves or have eating disorders
- Be secretive and take/make unexplained phone calls
- Excessively and secretly use technology
- Use sexual language
